

## IMPORTANT INFORMATION FOR MINORS

**VERY IMPORTANT** - The Permission to Travel Letter must be completed and notarized if the traveler is age 17 or younger on the date of travel. This document must be signed by both legal parents (legal parent as stated on your birth certificate, unless adopted). In order to travel to Central and South America, minors not accompanied by <u>both</u> legal guardians must possess both a passport and this Permission to Travel Letter.

**Note:** The Permission to Travel Letter must be signed and notarized <u>within</u> 30 days of your travel date. Also, please make sure the notary public's commission does not expire prior to the group's travel dates.

- -If the minor's parents are divorced, one of the following is required:
  - a) Both legal parents' signatures
  - b) Legal guardian's signature and a copy of the divorce decree stating full custody

**Note:** If divorce decree states joint custody, both legal parents must sign the travel permission letter.

-If one or both parents are deceased, the minor must provide appropriate notarized affidavits or death certificates.
